SQE candidates

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Here are the steps you need to take before applying for admission as a solicitor of England and Wales. We also offer guidance on when to do this, but the steps do not have to be done in a set order.

You'll also find a personalised SQE qualification checklist within mySRA (in 'My profile') that tracks your progress to admission and highlights next steps.

Create your accounts - do this first

- Create a mySRA account this is where you will tell us about your degree, work experience and apply for admission. Find out how to <u>create an account [https://jobs.sra.org.uk/mysra/get-mysra-account/#heading_a27d]</u>.
- Create an SQE assessment account to book your exams and get your results. <u>Find out how [https://sqe.sra.org.uk/registering-and-booking]</u>.
- Please make sure the names match exactly on the two accounts.

Validate your degree - anytime

- Your degree must be a <u>UK degree or equivalent level 6 qualification</u> [https://jobs.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/sqe/check-validate-qualification/degree-equivalent/] and can be in any subject. - You can also apply for equivalence to a degree using other qualifications (eg CILEX level 3 qualification) and/or relevant work experience. Find out how to apply for an equivalence

- If you are a solicitor apprentice, your degree or equivalent level 6
 qualification will be validated through your SQE assessment
 account.

Retrieve SQE assessment results - passed both exams

 You'll need to retrieve your SQE results in mySRA once you have passed all your required assessments. Log into mySRA, and in 'Start a new application' you'll find the 'Retrieve your SQE results' application.



Register your qualifying work experience - anytime

- You must register two years' <u>qualifying work experience</u> [https://jobs.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/sqe/qualifying-work-experience-candidates/] before you can apply for admission Find out more about <u>recording</u> <u>your work experience [https://jobs.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/sqe/qualifying-work-experience-candidates/registering-qualifying-work-experience/].</u>
- If you are a solicitor apprentice, this can be any two-year period within your apprenticeship.

Background checks and suitability - just before applying for admission
